I led the organization's efforts to ensure universal access to health care and to eliminate health care disparities.
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Research Interests

I am a practicing primary care pediatrician with interdisciplinary doctoral training in the methods used in health policy evaluation. A major area of my research is the opioid epidemic. I have conducted numerous national studies describing the epidemiology, safety, and distribution of opioid prescribing to pediatric patients, dental patients, and surgical patients. I have also conducted quasi-experimental studies that have evaluated the effects of opioid prescribing limits and prescription drug monitoring program use mandates on opioid prescribing, the effect of cost-sharing on naloxone dispensing, and the effect of eliminating the buprenorphine waiver requirement on buprenorphine dispensing.

A second area of my research is out-of-pocket spending. My studies have assessed the magnitude of out-of-pocket spending for epinephrine auto-injectors, insulin, orphan drugs, childbirth, and COVID-19 hospitalizations. My work on out-of-pocket spending for epinephrine auto-injectors resulted in a television appearance on *The Today Show*.

A third area of my research is low-value care. For example, I translated recommendations from sources such as Choosing Wisely into 20 claims-based measures of low-value pediatric services. Using these measures and national claims data, I found that 9% of privately insured children and 11% of publicly insured children received at least one of the 20 low-value services in 2014. As another example, I created the first comprehensive ICD-10-CM-based system for assessing antibiotic overuse in administrative data. Using this scheme and 2016 national commercial claims data, I found that 23% of antibiotic prescriptions written to privately insured children and non-elderly adults were written for conditions that do not justify the use of antibiotics.
