My primary research activities focus on the promotion of medication adherence, health care transitions, and health-related quality of life (HRQOL) in pediatric solid organ transplantation and pediatric liver disease. I am also involved in collaborative research focused on the promotion of self-management skills in other pediatric populations including childhood cancer survivors, children with obesity, children with diabetes, and adolescents with inflammatory bowel disease (IBD). My research activities have been continuously supported through funding from the University of Michigan and the NIH.
