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In January 2018, I joined the faculty at the University of Michigan School of Social Work faculty as Professor and Marion Elizabeth Blue Endowed Chair in Children and Families. Formerly, I was Professor and Co-Director of the 3DL Partnership at the School of Social Work, University of Washington and Adjunct Professor at the University of Washington College of Education. My scholarship focuses on the correlates and consequences of child maltreatment, risk and resiliency, and the promotion of positive youth development. My funded studies and publications examine health-risk behaviors in children exposed to child maltreatment and other forms of adversity, protective factors that buffer against early risk exposure, and prevention. I have published more than 100 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters on these and related topics. As an international scholar, I work with policy makers, school and child welfare professionals, and community partners to increase the visibility, application, and sustainability of evidence-based programs and practices in prevention, social emotional learning, and trauma-responsive systems. In my work as Co-Director of the 3DL Partnership at the University of Washington, I collaborated statewide with academic colleagues, students, and service providers to conduct research and translate research findings into practice and policy goals to strengthen and reform systems that serve children, youth, and families.
